

Educational Exchange Opportunities

The Fulbright Program

The flagship international educational exchange program sponsored by the U.S. Government, widely known as the Fulbright Program, is designed to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other countries. With this goal as a starting point, the Fulbright Program has provided more than 318,000 participants, chosen for their leadership potential, with the opportunity to observe each others' political, economic and cultural institutions, exchange ideas, and embark on joint ventures of importance to the general welfare of the world's inhabitants. The Fulbright Program was established in 1946 under legislation introduced by former Senator J. William Fulbright of Arkansas. The Fulbright Program is administered by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the United States Department of State. The Fulbright Program awards approximately 8,000 new grants annually, and operates in 155 countries around the world.

Fulbright Scholar Program in the United States for Macedonian Citizens

This program enable citizens of Macedonia to study, conduct research, and pursue their academic and professional interests at leading universities and other educational institutions in the U.S. The awards (4 - 9 months) are granted through an open competition, and selected candidates will be required to appear for an interview by a committee. Fulbright Foreign Student Program in the United States for Macedonian Citizens

The Fulbright Foreign Student Program brings Macedonian citizens to the United States for master's degree or Ph.D. research at U.S. universities or other appropriate institutions. Foreign students apply for Fulbright Fellowships through the U.S. Embassy in Skopje. The Institute of International Education (IIE) arranges academic placement for most Fulbright nominees and supervises participants during their stay in the United States. The Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program brings accomplished professionals from designated countries in Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Caribbean, the Middle East, Europe and Eurasia to the United States at a midpoint in their careers for a year of study and related professional experience. The Program provides a basis for establishing long-lasting productive partnerships and relationships between citizens of the United States and their professional counterparts in other countries, fostering an exchange of knowledge and mutual understanding throughout the world. Fulbright Senior Specialist Program

This Program was initiated in 2001 to provide Fulbright grants of two to six weeks to qualified scholars to work with their professional counterparts at foreign academic institutions worldwide.

To participate in the program, the requesting institution is invited to apply through the Embassy specifying the expertise required and giving the name of the specialist, if one has been identified. The final selection of the specialist remains the responsibility of the Office of Academic Exchange of the State Department.

There is no deadline for application, but it is advisable to contact the Embassy prior to making a formal application.

Study of the United States Institutes (SUSI)

Study of the United States Institutes (SUSI): are intensive post-graduate level academic programs with integrated study tours whose purpose is to provide foreign university faculty and other scholars the opportunity to deepen their understanding of American society, culture and institutions. The ultimate goal is to strengthen curricula and to improve the quality of teaching about the United States in academic institutions abroad.
